



Tagline: Strengthening the Integrity of Racing

Mission: The RMTC strives to develop and promote uniform rules, policies and testing standards at the national level; coordinate research and educational programs that seek to ensure the integrity of racing and the health and welfare of racehorses and participants; and to protect the interests of the racing public.

Goals:

- Form a grassroots initiative to secure passage of uniform model medication rules and penalty guidelines in all pari-mutuel racing states
- Encourage state legislators to provide more funding for drug testing and racing commission investigative staff
- Institute national minimum standards and best practices for drug testing laboratories
- Implement a laboratory ISO accreditation program and an independent Equine Quality Assurance Program
- Acquire and analyze unknown substances to develop information on new threats to the integrity of racing
- Provide communications guidance for state racing commissions, and educate fans and participants on the progress and developments of U.S. equine drug testing programs, RMTC research studies and recommended medication policies

Accomplishments:

- Adoption of model rules for uniform policy on therapeutic medications started or complete in 31 of 34 states currently conducting pari-mutuel horse racing
- Adoption of model rules for uniform policy on the regulation of anabolic steroids in 32 of 34 states currently conducting pari-mutuel horse racing, which represent 99.98% of total Thoroughbred handle
- Approval of model rules for more severe uniform penalties for the use of prohibited drugs and practices by the RCI board of directors
- Development of a model rule on out-of-competition drug testing approved by the RCI board of directors
- Funding of more than \$1.5 million in drug testing research
- Launch of a five-part drug testing initiative to develop a comprehensive drug testing plan for U.S. horse racing testing laboratories
- Establishment of a post-doctoral research fellowship program, with initial funding of two candidates in the amount of \$450,000 over three years
- Creation of a withdrawal times online database for therapeutic medications for horsemen and veterinarians
- Creation of a public recent rulings online database for drug-related rulings

History: In 2000, the American Association of Equine Practitioners hosted the “Racehorse Medication Summit” during the annual Symposium on Racing in Tucson, Ariz. The summit brought together representatives of 23 industry stakeholder groups for a facilitated closed-door meeting in order to determine potential consensus points on the most basic elements of a uniform national medication policy for racehorses. This meeting led to the formation of the RMTC.

Organization: The RMTC is incorporated as a 501 (c) (3) charitable organization, with both scientific and educational purposes. It is governed by a board of directors consisting of 25 industry stakeholder groups:
